

## FALL BLOOMING CAMELLIAS

Camellias are a wonderful addition to any garden where it has a northern or eastern exposure. They have evergreen leaves and beautiful flowers in the fall or spring depending on the variety. The fall blooming Camellias are exceptional as they bring color to the landscape in October, November and sometimes in December when not many other plants are in bloom.

Flower form and color are important in deciding which variety to choose.

**Flower Form** – the 6 forms are very closely related to other popular flower forms

**Single** – one row of 8 or less petals with conspicuous stamens

**Semi-double** – two or more rows of petals with conspicuous stamens

**Anemone** – one or more rows of outer petals lying flat or undulating with the center being a mass of intermingled petaloids and stamens

**Peony** – a deep rounded flower with many petals intermingled with or without stamens showing

**Rose Form Double** – imbricated petals, showing stamens in the center only when fully open

**Formal Double** – fully imbricated, many rows of petals, never showing stamens

### **‘Ashton’s Pride’ – Pink, Single**



Soft lavender pink single blooms cover this average dense spreading plant from October – December. The plant resembles an Abelia in habit and texture. Zone 6

### **‘Ashton’s Snow’ – White, Semi-double**



This camellia has a long blooming season from early November to late January and is cold hardy to -15°. It has a globular dense growth habit with dark green leaves. Zone 6

### **‘Long Island Pink’ – Pink, Single**



It has multitudes of single pink blooms on this dense, vigorous growing plant with dark wavy foliage. It’s a favorite of many and was found on Long Island. Zone 6

### **‘Mason Farm’ – White, Single**



It is a vigorous plant that blooms freely and early in autumn with white, large, single flowers tinged with pink. Excellent cold hardiness to -10°. Zone 6

**'Northern Exposure' – White, Single**

Pinkish buds open to a white crinkled-textured single flower with yellow stamens above large foliage on an upright, moderate growth plant to 8'. Excellent disease resistance. Zone 6

**'Winter's Darling' – Cerise Pink, Anemone**



Deep pink, 'darling' miniature, anemone form flowers bloom in November and December on this fast growing, upright plant. Excellent cold hardiness to -10°F. Zone 6

**'Winter's Fancy' – Pink, Semi-double**

It produces beautiful, deep pink, semi-double crinkle-textured blooms in October-November on an upright and outward plant. It's great for a hedge plant. Cold hardy to -5°F. Zone 6

**AVAILABLE**

**'Winter's Interlude' – Pink, Anemone**



If you are looking for a faster growing hedge, this is an excellent option as it grows to 6-8' tall with a 4-6' spread. Light pink anemone form blooms appear in mid-late fall over dark green glossy foliage. It has excellent winter hardiness to -15°F. Zone 6

**'Winter's Joy' – Bright Pink, Semi-double**



Vigorous, upright, compact evergreen shrub, valued for luxuriant rich green foliage and pink, semi-double, scented flowers. Excellent winter hardiness to -10°F. Zone 6

**'Winter's Star' – Pink, Single**



Large pink blooms with lavender overtones appear in early autumn on a semi-glossy, dark green plant of moderate, upright growth. Zone 6

**'Winter's Waterlily' – White, Formal-double**



Beautiful white anemone to formal double flowers bloom in mid-autumn on a semi-glossy dark green globular plant of moderate growth. Excellent winter hardiness to -15°F. Zone 6
